A FIRST APPROACH TO ALICANTE

- Located on the east coast of Spain, it is **the second largest city** in the Valencia Region. The province of Alicante is the fifth largest in Spain in population.
- Alicante is the capital of the Costa Blanca, where we find other popular destinations such as Denia, Benidorm, Torrevieja and Elche.
- It is a **medium-size cosmopolitan city**, with around 345.000 inhabitants, and it overlooks the **Mediterranean Sea**. Around 12% of the city's population is foreign.
- It is an important university city and also the chosen location for the head office of the European Union Intellectual Property Office (EUIPO).





TRANSPORT

Alicante's complete **transport network** includes the **Alicante-Elche International Airport**, with connections from many Spanish and European cities. It is the fifth most important airport in the country and it offers domestic and international flights to over 120 airports.

Regular direct flights to and from airports in major European cities ensure convenient, easy access to Alicante from many countries such as the UK, France, Germany, the Netherlands, Portugal, Belgium, Italy, Finland, Sweden, Norway and many others.

It is connected with the city centre by bus.





TRANSPORT

The **high-speed train network (AVE)** enables access to the city centre from many parts of Spain. You can travel from Madrid in around 2 hours, Barcelona in 4,5 hours and Valencia in about 90 minutes. Alicante enjoys an extensive road network as well.

Getting around the city and its metropolitan area is easy and comfortable, thanks to the network of **urban and interurban buses**, as well as the **tram**. The tram connects the city centre with several destinations along the north coast of Alicante-Costa Blanca.

The port of Alicante offers commercial, transport and recreational services. Every year the port of Alicante welcomes an increasing number of cruise passengers to the city and the Costa Blanca.









REMOTE WORKING IN ALICANTE & DIGITAL NOMADS

Remote working has become a booming option that provides great advantages for both companies and the workers themselves. The region of Valencia is one of the Spanish areas with the highest number of remote workers, and the city of Alicante is a clear example of a perfect place for **remote working**, **workation and flexibusiness**, where the general advantages of living whilst working remotely are concentrated.

The existing **fibre optics and 5G connectivity network** in the city makes Alicante a very well-connected destination, which is an essential element and a guarantee for remote workers.





COWORKING AND COLIVING SPACES IN ALICANTE

In Alicante there is an important ecosystem based on technological transformation and the digital economy, led by the **Distrito Digital** and **Alicante Futura** projects, launched by the Generalitat Valenciana and Alicante City Council respectively.

In the most strategic areas of the city you will find a wide variety of **coworking and coliving** spaces adapted to the needs of remote workers. Companies, freelancers, small businesses..., all have a place in these spaces which provide flexible plans for the development of professional projects independently at the same time as promoting collaborative work.

A CULTURAL DESTINATION

- There is an attractive and **varied selection of museums** and exhibition rooms **as well as cultural centres** capable of satisfying all tastes, including the MARQ Archaeological Museum, the Ocean Race museum and the MACA Modern Art Museum amongst other interesting options.
- Alicante also enjoys a great collection of historical monuments all over the city, specially in the area of the old town, including the **Santa Bárbara and San Fernando Castles**.







ALICANTE: A CITY THAT OVERLOOKS THE MEDITERRANEAN SEA

- Alicante enjoys warm winters and hot summers, with an annual average **temperature of 18°C** and over **3.000** hours of sun a year.
- There are over 25 km of coastline including 9 km of excellent sandy beaches with crystal clear waters, with sports facilities and well prepared designated areas for the physically and mentally handicapped.
- The **island of Tabarca** is the only inhabited island in the region of Valencia and has been declared a **Mediterranean Marine Reserve** for the quality of its waters and for the biodiversity of its flora and fauna.
- **Nautical sports** are practicable during the whole year: sailing, diving, surfing and boat charter amongst other options.







A GASTRONOMIC AND WINE LOVERS DESTINATION

- Alicante's cuisine is typically Mediterranean.
- The history of Alicante, its geographical location, the climate and the fertility of its lands have provided an enormous richness and variety to the region's food, which can be tasted in the bars and restaurants throughout the city.
- Restaurante Monastrell, located along the marina, boasts one **Michelin star.** In 2020, Restaurante Baeza & Rufete, located in San Juan Beach, was also awarded one **Michelin star**. So, at present, there are two restaurants with Michelin Star in the city.
- Local wines produced in the area of Alicante enjoy its own Protected Certificate of Origin (Denominación de Origen Protegida Vinos de Alicante).







SHOPPING AND LEISURE

- There are **varied and very attractive shops and shopping centres** dotted all around the city and residential areas offering a great selection of goods and combining internationally known and local brands.
- In addition to the wide choice of shops, **Alicante has plenty of cultural offerings too**: cinemas, theatres, exhibition rooms and cultural centres.
- The "Tardeo", a term used to describe nightlife enjoyed in the afternoon and early evening, is very popular in Alicante. It is enjoyed by locals and holidaymakers of all ages alike.

The yearly calendar is marked by **numerous festivals**. The joy of the city is represented by the great variety of "fiestas" that leave the visitor with such a lasting impression. The chances are that one of Alicante's many festivals will coincide with your stay.
